## NARRATIVE SUMMARY

Debris burning (slash pile burns over 48" in size) is open county-wide, however Montana DEQ's
Winter Burning Period is in effect as of December 1<sup>st</sup>. During this period, burners are not only
required to purchase and activate a county burn permit for each day of their burn, but they must
also apply for and receive a permit from Montana DEQ prior to burning. Burners can visit
<a href="https://deq.mt.gov/air/Programs/burning">https://deq.mt.gov/air/Programs/burning</a> or call 406-444-1452 for more information regarding the
Winter Burn Period and to apply for a Winter Burn Request. The Winter Burn Period extends
through the last day of February.
